A warm word of welcome to all my brothers and sisters in the Lord who are visiting our parish this weekend. It is good that you are here—this is your home! My hope for you this weekend is that you will take a closer, deeper look at your Catholic faith.

Many who are here at these Coming Home Weekend Masses were raised Catholic, but have fallen away or grown inactive for many different reasons. Some are valid—you've been hurt or treated badly or disrespected. How sorry I am this has happened—and how I long to help you heal. I pray today will be the beginning of that process. Some reasons are not so valid—you've grown a little lazy, maybe priorities are askew or perhaps you are angry at the Church for the sins of a few. Whatever the reason, the truth is Jesus longs to be one with you again in Holy Communion.

Yes our Church has problems—we always have and we always will. We are a Church of saints and sinners! But we must remember that the main reason we come to Church each week is to receive the Eucharist—the Bread of Life! In the Eucharist, we are literally embraced body and soul by Jesus, who seeks to heal our broken hearts, give us His peace and His joy, show us a better way to live. In survey after survey, the number one reason Catholics come back to the Church is because they hunger for the Eucharist—and it's right here waiting for you!

Being here today may stir many feelings in you. I ask that you take all those feelings to prayer and ask Jesus to guide you. Coming back home is not usually a one-time event.
