Dear Parishioners,

There is a lot of confusion about Marriage Annulments, so I thought this week I would try to clarify some of the misunderstandings. A Marriage Annulment is a declaration from the Catholic Church that a specific marriage, presumably begun in good faith and thought by all to be a marriage, was, in fact, not a sacramental union according to the teachings of the Catholic Church. In other words, for one or more reasons, a sacramental marriage bond was never created between the bride and groom.

This is different from a divorce (a legal document issued by the government) which states the marriage bond existed and then ceased to exist. Since Jesus creates the sacramental bond between a husband and wife, the Church believes it cannot cease to exist until the person dies. Therefore, for the Catholic Church, the sacramental bond either exists until death or it doesn't exist at all. The purpose of the annulment process is to determine if the couple said their marriage vows with a proper understanding and maturity so that Jesus would create an unbreakable bond between them.

If a marriage is annulled, the man and woman are free to marry another person in the Church. If the marriage is not annulled, neither person may marry in the Church because the sacramental marriage bond still exists. The following are some important facts to keep in mind:

- Divorced Catholics ARE NOT excommunicated from the Church. A divorce has no bearing on the sacramental marriage bond. As long as the divorced person has not remarried, he or she is welcome to receive Holy Communion.
- How much money you have is NOT CONSIDERED in the success or speed of the annulment process. While there are legitimate costs, no annulment is stopped due to lack of money. Additionally, every case is decided on the facts alone.
- Children of annulled marriages ARE JUST AS LEGITIMATE as any other child. Annulments DO NOT affect the relationship of parents and children.
- Some annulments do take a year or more to investigate, but others take as little as ONE WEEK.
- Former spouses do not have to meet with or speak to each other during the annulment process.

Thank you to everyone who has re-committed themselves to this ministry.

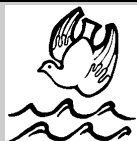

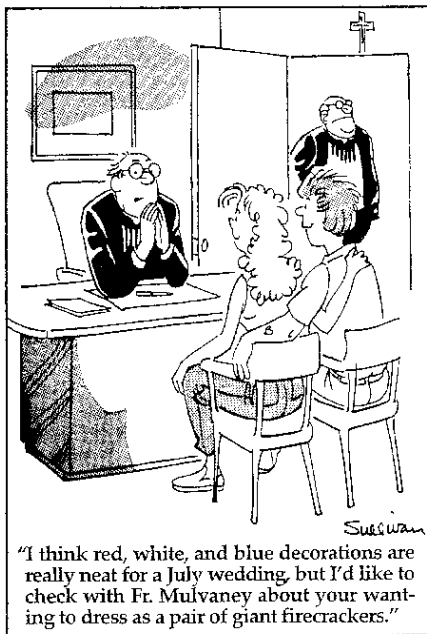
