Dear Parishioners

Last week I shared with you five of the “10 Fundamentals of Effective Child Rearing” suggested by family psychologist and parenting expert John Rosemond. Let me continue with these last five wise insights:

- 1) *Put yourself at the center of your child’s attention, not the other way around.* Always remember that the more attention you pay a child, the less attention the child will pay to you.
- 2) *Put your child into a meaningful role in your family, one that is defined in terms of responsibilities known as chores.* By the time your child is four, he/she should be contributing significant time and effort on a daily basis to the maintenance of the household. Without chores, a child is a mere consumer, on a perpetual entitlement program, and entitlements do not strengthen people or culture.
- 3) *Keep television and other electronic media out of your child’s life until your child has learned to read well and is self-entertaining.* The research is clear that electronic media shortens attention span, interferes with the development of certain critical thinking skills, and develops a dependency that leads to frequent complaints of boredom. The more time spent in front of a screen, the less creative a child will become.
- 4) *From day one, keep clutter out of your child’s life by keeping toys and other “stuff” at a minimum.* Paradoxically, children who entertain themselves well tend to have few toys. These children are also more grateful for and take better care of what they have.
- 5) *Emphasize manners, not skills.* Sixty years ago, most children came to overcrowded first grades not knowing their ABCs, yet at the end of the year were reading at a higher level than today’s children, most of whom are already reading in kindergarten. That happened because parents of sixty years ago taught proper behavior, not skills—therefore, teachers taught skills, not proper behavior.

I think those are excellent, but he left out one thing: teach children to pray and bring them to Mass! Nothing helps a child more than knowing Jesus and Mary are always there to help them. God bless you in the week ahead.
