Because loving as Christ loves is the catalyst for the healing of a woman's hurt heart. Is this difficult? It can be. In fact, it can be crucifying, especially if our love is rejected. That's why we need the Eucharist. Jesus will give us the strength and the perseverance to love as He loves and hopefully inspire the women in our lives to seek healing of their hurts. And ladies, you need to help us men by knowing the hurts in your hearts—and giving them to Jesus for healing. Hurts that are not healed usually lead to harsh words and actions. Hurts that are healed allow your hearts to open to love in your life—which is a win for all of us. I hope this helps to clarify things a little more. God bless you in the week ahead.

We will be holding a “Flu Shot Clinic” in the church hall next Sunday, October 18th from 9:00 AM to 12:00 Noon. The Wellness Company will vaccinate children (six months and older) and adults with the **regular seasonal flu vaccine**. The vaccine is FREE for those who are insured by Blue Cross/Blue Shield, Medicare Part B and UnitedHealthcare. The co-pay is \$15.00 for all other insurance companies. If you don’t have health insurance, the cost is \$25.00 for the flu vaccine.

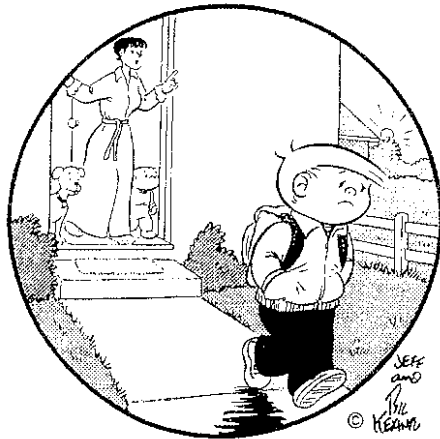
