Dear Parishioners,

Last Monday, the Rhode Island State Police gave a presentation to St. Rose School students and parents on internet safety. A special emphasis was placed on cyber-bullying, that is bullying through technology. Here are some facts you should know about this growing problem:

- 43% of children have been threatened online.
- Being ignored or disrespected are the most common forms of cyber-bullying.
- About 75% of students have visited a website bashing another student.
- The psychological and emotional outcomes of cyber-bullying are often worse than real-life bullying because the internet and cell phones are available all the time.
- Cyber-bullying occurs in chat rooms (like Facebook), blogs, e-mail and text messages.
- Girls are about twice as likely as boys to be victims and perpetrators of cyber-bullying.
- Incidents of cyber-bullying have doubled in the past five years, and continue to grow.

Parents, this is a real threat to the well-being of your children. Here are some tips to prevent cyber-bullying:

- Tell children to never pass along harmful or cruel messages or images.
- Teach children to delete suspicious emails without opening them.
- Teach children how to block cyberbullies.
- Have your children tell you about any cyber-bullying they experience or see.
- Supervise your children's time online. Put computers in common areas.
- Pay attention to your child. If you notice he/she is withdrawn, depressed or reluctant to attend school or social events, investigate right away.

The internet and cell phones are amazing inventions. But like any invention, they can be used for good or evil. Vigilance is essential to protecting your children from harm online. Please watch carefully—young minds and hearts are at stake.

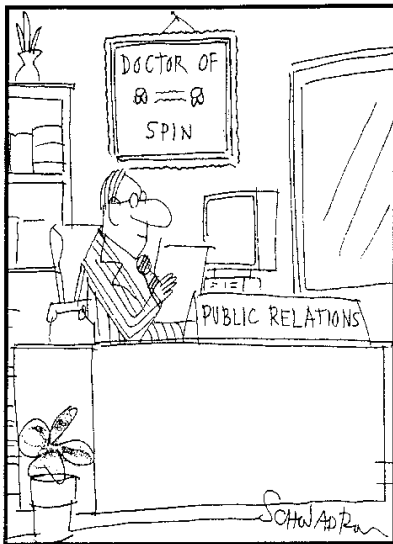
